Trinity	Christian people believe in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
Holy spirit	The third part of the trinity; God as spiritually active in the world.
Moses	An important person who led the Israelites out of Egyptian slavery.
Allah	Allah is the Arabic word
Trimurti	The three Hindu gods Brahma, Vishnu, and Shiva.
Brahma	The creator god in the Hindu faith.
Vishnu	The preserver god in the Hindu faith.
Shiva	The destroyer god in the Hindu faith

Muslim names for Allah		Muslims have 99 names for Allah including: The Most Merciful, The Forgiver, The Loving One, The Protecting Friend, The Generous, The Mighty and The Owner of All.
Hindu ideas about God		Hindus believe that The Ultimate Reality is Brahman. This is like a prism. The single colours are like the gods and goddesses in that they each represent aspects of the divine One.
