<p>Moral Development</p> 	<p>Strong promotion of our school Christian values; Assemblies to promote human rights, global issues and special festivals and culturally important events. <p>Cultural Development</p> 	<p>Citizenship education through PSHE; Arts education including Music, Drama, Dance, Design and Technology, and Art; Access to the languages and cultures of other countries through the curriculum (both Foundation and Core subjects); Promotion of racial equality and community cohesion through the school's ethos, informing all policy and practice.
