To understand about social media and the advantages these sites have brought as well as the numerous problems such as cyber bullying. To develop respect for one another both online and in person.</p>
<p>Cultural Development</p> 	<p>To think about the impact technology has had on not only their own lives, but the lives of others. Technology has had an impact of different cultures and backgrounds in different ways and through the curriculum. Technology is fast developing and ever changing. To understand that our digital footprint is everlasting and remains in our search history.</p>
