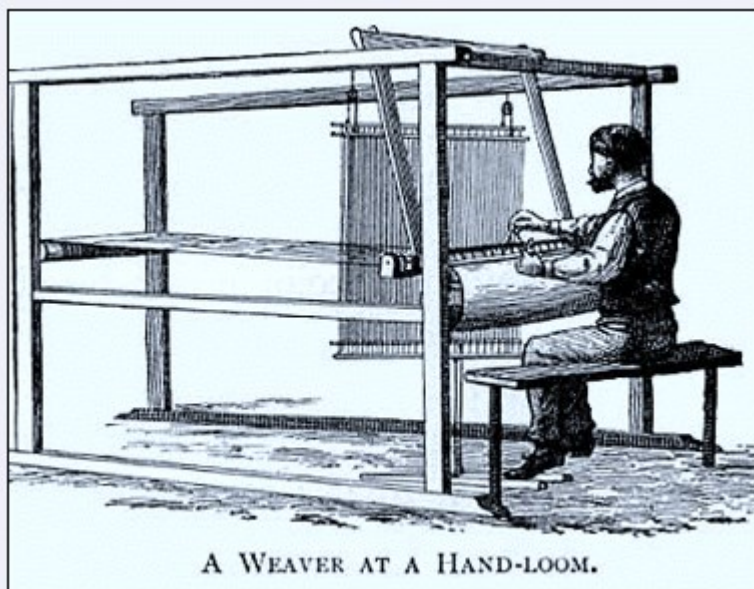

## Our Beautiful Village of Litton

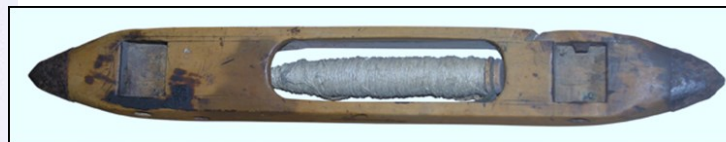


Litton Mill




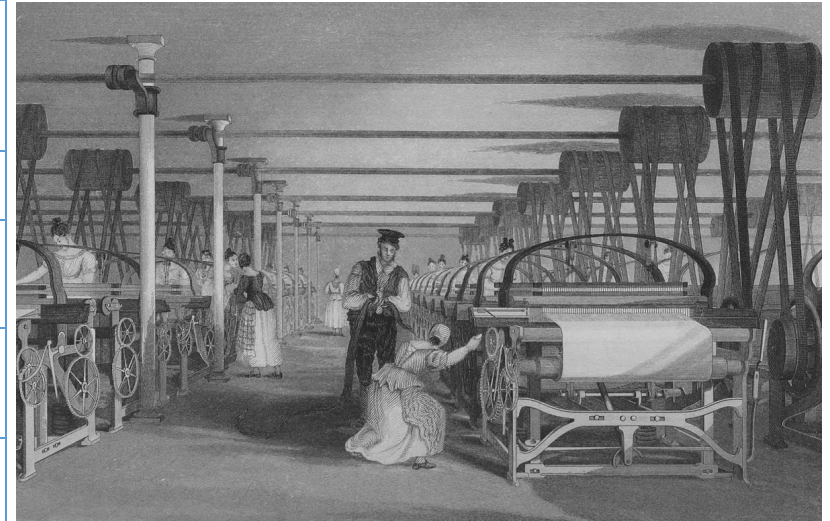
### John Kay invented the Flying Shuttle in 1733.

The shuttle was given wheels. The weaver would pull a string to send the shuttle “flying” across the loom. Wider cloth could now be woven and much faster than before.

Textiles	Cloths produced in a factory.
Cotton	A natural fibre from plants.
Mills	The factories that made cloth. They employed thousands of people.
Industrial Revolution	A time <b>from creating goods by hand to using machines</b> . Its start and end are widely debated by scholars, but the period generally spanned from about 1760 to 1840.
Primary Source	First hand account of information.
Secondary Source	It may contain pictures, quotes or graphics of primary sources.
Investigate	To find out some information.
Log Book	A book recording how many people attended work or school.
Inhabitants	People who live in a place.
Looms	Machines used to make cotton.
Poverty	A state of being extremely poor.
